- 1 The original Delta Junction Fire Station was moved where in 1972? (This is one of two buildings; the other was demolished, i.e. burned in place.)
- 2 There is a massive piece of moving equipment in our state named after our great city. It has never been to this town and will never be in this town. What is it?
- 3 What year was the nuclear power plant at Fort Greely deemed "active and turned over to control of the Army" from the contractor?
- 4 Who was the local postmaster who retired in 1973?
- 5 In what year was the local Farmer's Co-op formed?
- 6 Who was the first official mayor of Delta Junction?
- 7 What was the name of the local dog musher that took third place in the 1979 Iditarod?
- 8 During the pipeline days Delta Junction, for a brief time, had a police department. How many members were there? (Hint: Think hard. This is a trick question.)
- 9 The Buffalo Wallow is an annual square dancing event held in Delta Junction. What year did it start?
- 10 In 1972 Delta Junction held its first Junior Miss Pageant. Who was the first young lady to be crowned Junior Miss in Delta?
- 11 What was purchased for the city in 1972 for approximately 7,000,000 Betty Crocker points? These points were collected over a two-year period.
